\$368 Million Up For Grabs In Tonight's Mega Millions® Jackpot Draw

SuperLotto Plus® Rolls Up To This Saturday's \$26 Million Draw

SACRAMENTO – California Lottery players have a chance to win an estimated \$368 million in tonight's [Mega Millions](#) drawing at 8 p.m. Even second place for a single ticket win, matching all five numbers and missing only the Mega Ball, could be a multimillion-dollar prize tonight.

Excitement is also building as [SuperLotto Plus](#) continues to grow after a string of quick wins kicked off 2026:

- In the March 28 drawing, **Justiniano Trinidad** matched all six numbers to win **\$10 million** on a ticket purchased at 7-Eleven, 4193 Central Avenue, in Fremont.
- Just four drawings earlier, on March 14, **Judy Martinez**, also matched all six [SuperLotto Plus](#) numbers to win **\$10 million** on a ticket purchased at A&J Happy Hour, 414 W. Lincoln Avenue, in Orange.
- Two weeks earlier, on February 28, **Melvin Cook**, won the first jackpot of 2026, taking home a prize worth **\$32 million** with a ticket purchased at the Circle K, 681 E. Foothill Blvd, in Upland. Their win ended the run that began in December of 2025.

Mega Millions draws take place Tuesdays and Fridays at 8 p.m., and the entry must be made by 7:45 p.m.

SuperLotto Plus draws take place Wednesdays and Saturdays at 7:57 p.m., after the draw entry closes at 7:45 p.m.

No sales or ticket validations can take place from 7:45 p.m. to 7:50 p.m., which is when a draw break separates sales during draw periods. Tickets sold after 7:50 p.m. are ineligible for that night's draw but are eligible for the following draw.
